




## **Procedure for architects**

- When a flat roof is designed to a falling gradient or the alternative with cut-to-falls elements is specified, the technical consultant in charge has to be informed. He will arrange for the necessary steps to be taken. After defining the exact external dimensions, the position of the outlets, relevant heights, doorsteps etc. our CAD department will make, free of charge, a drawing of the roof system including precise measurements. This layout indicates heights on edges, irregularities in slopes, falling gradients as well as the exact size of the FOAMGLAS® TAPERED ROOF SYSTEM. These details are necessary to define the exact specification clauses for the submission of the roof.






## **Installation drawing**

#### Installation instructions


- Apply bituminous primer with roller (or spraying equipment) on the clean and dry concrete surface, coverage ~ 0.3 l / m². (1)
- Apply the FOAMGLAS® slabs fully bonded to the substrate with hot bitumen poured from a bitumen can, with staggered and bitumen-filled butted joints. Coverage  $\sim 5.0$  7.0 kg /  $m^2$ , dependent on the thickness of the insulation:

Dip a short as well as a long side of the slab in the poured bitumen and press into position against already laid slabs. Surplus bitumen spilt at the side must be removed with the next slab in order to avoid irregularities. (2 / 3)

- Possible waterproofing variation: Apply two layers of bituminous waterproofing membranes covering the entire surface. The first layer is applied using the pour and roll technique, the second (root-resistant) is torched on. Joints overlapping at least 100 mm, with staggered courses. (Combination of bituminous and synthetic waterproofing layers on request). (4)
- Apply the separating / protective layer, with overlapping joints. (5)
- Installation of the service or protective layer (gravel, pavement slabs, planting etc.).

## **Recommendations for the contractor**

- The build up and tolerances of the substrate have to be in accordance with relevant standards and guidelines.
- Substrate and ambient temperature should not be below + 5° C.
- A layer of waterproofing membrane must be applied immediately after the insulation has been installed. At the end of each day or every work interruption, all remaining naked surfaces as well as the front sides must be covered with a topcoat.
- Protective layers should be applied immediately after the application of the second waterproofing layer.
- Adequate measures should be taken in order to avoid any risks of damage by other contractors during construction.
- Protect sensitive components provided by other suppliers against blobs of hot bitumen and the effect of heat.
